RULES & REGULATIONS GOVERNING THE FAT BOB MOTORCYCLE RAFFLE

1. Winning raffle ticket will be chosen at the 2nd Annual 4.01K Race for Financial Fitness.
2. The Junior Achievement of Southern Nevada reserves the right not to award the prize in the event of any irregularities, such as age requirement.
3. Named sponsors have no liability.
4. Employees of Southern Nevada Harley-Davidson and family are not eligible to win. Management reserves all right.
5. All entries (raffle ticket) must be filled out completely, accompanied by a minimum \$100.00 per ticket, and delivered to JASN or an authorized representative of JASN, or submitted on-line, and received by no later than April 2019 to be considered eligible to win the Harley-Davidson Fat Bob Motorcycle.
6. No Cash equivalent prizes will be provided in lieu of designated prizes. Any and all taxes and similar fees are the sole responsibility of the winners.
7. By entering, entrants release JASN and its members, agents, employees, and other related entities from any and all liability with respect to prizes.
8. Positive identification may be required to claim prize.

What is my raffle number?

Your raffle number will be given to you on a physical raffle ticket which will be tracked by JASN staff. All raffle tickets bought online will receive their raffle number via email.

How does it work?

There will be 500 raffle tickets available for purchase for \$100, each ticket enters you into a raffle to win a Harley-Davidson Fat Bob Motorcycle. Tickets will be sold in person at JASN events and online from November 2018 – April 2019. The winning raffle ticket will be chosen at the 2nd Annual 4.01K Race for Financial Fitness in April 2019. Final date and time to be announced later this fall.

What time is the 4.01K Race for Financial Fitness?

How will I know if my ticket wins?

Junior Achievement of Southern Nevada will be choosing the winning raffle ticket at the 2nd Annual 4.01K Race for Financial Fitness. You do not need to be present to win. If the winning ticket holder is not present, they will be contacted using the information provided when purchasing the raffle ticket. You have 30 days to claim your winning prize.
